1.0 Introduction

Highways and footpaths have long been a concern to the residents of Monk Fryston. In particular the speed and number of vehicles using the road, combined with the absence of a safe designated crossing place has severely affected residents' quality of life. The detrimental effect of the numerous HGV both on welfare and infrastructure also raises concern. Traffic flow and parking issues on Water Lane have also raised questions as to pedestrian safety, particularly outside the village primary school.

Speed issues have been addressed in the past with a survey specifically commissioned by the Parish Council and speeds are currently being monitored by the Vehicle Activated Signs installed by the Parish Council following grant funding from North Yorkshire Police and Fire Commissioner. Police surveillance vehicles also operate in the village Previous surveys assessing the need and positioning of a pedestrian survey have had little success.

2.0 Responsibilities

The group will follow the rules and regulations of the Parish Council this includes standing orders and financial regulations and code of conduct

2.1 Footpaths

The group will be responsible for general oversight of all known PROW in the Parish.

For any new paths not on the 1949 definitive Map record the group shall apply for a Definitive Map Modification Order (DMMO) to support inclusion of the same using NYCC supporting documentation.

The group will as far as is possible, ensure that NYCC realises all its obligations in respect of PROW and brings any failure to do so to the attention of Council.

If required the group will liaise with the Footpaths @ NYCC to ensure compliance to national guidelines.

2.2 Public Right of Ways

The group will inspect all sign posting and public information notices.

The group will identify responsibility for maintenance and upkeep of PROW within the Parish, ensuring the Parish Council upholds all obligations for the same.

2.3 Definitive Maps

The group will, within its powers, conform to the The Deregulation Act of 2015 to ensure the accuracy of all footpaths paths identified on Definitive Map Record within the Parish.

The group will, in carrying out its work, comply with the Wildlife and Countryside regulations 1993 (Definitive Maps and Statements, Schedule 7)

2.4 Highways

To address the concerns over road safety and produce an objective action plan

To review all possible means of collating and producing effective evidence to support that purpose.

To use every method within their means to collect resident support from the village in relation to any significant highways issues .

To address, in consultation with other bodies, appropriate measures to improve road safety. To consider securing other grants to support applicable projects

To ensure that any implemented project is sustainable, and that account of any ongoing maintenance costs are considered within the annual precept.

To produce, as required, objective and comprehensive reports, with supporting evidence, and present to relevant authorities at local and nation level.

3.0 Meetings

Membership will be of three Parish Councillors with a minimum of 2 in attendance at any meeting.

Meeting will be as and when necessary. Meting note takers will be decided at each meeting.

4.0 Accountability:

The Group is accountable to Monk Fryston Parish Council and is responsible for reporting back on activities of the group.

Within an agreed budget the group is authorised to make small purchases, through the clerk, for administration purposes such as room hire. Expenditure over and above this is subject to specific resolution by the Main Parish Council

The Main Parish Council will approve/reject any documentation submitted by the group.

If approved the group will be responsible through the clerk for promotion of documentation agreed.

5.0 Review:

The group will review its activities annually. This will include review of these terms of reference.

Notice to repair a highway maintainable at public expense under section 56 of the Highways Act 1980

- 1. The highway which runs in front of St Wilfrid's Church Monk Fryston in an East West direction (see Map 1 in appendices) is maintainable by the highway authority at the public expense and is currently in a poor state of repair.
- 2. You are now required under section 56 of the Highways Act 1980 to state:
 - a. whether you admit that the way in question is a highway; and
 - b. whether you admit that you are liable to maintain it.
- 3. If you fail to admit within one month of the date of this Notice, both that the way in question is a highway and that you are liable to maintain it, we intend to apply to the Crown Court for an Order requiring you to put the highway into proper repair.
- 4. We have provided supporting documents scheduled in the Appendices as firm and irrefutable evidence that the said highway is maintainable at public expense.



Appendix 1 General Statement of Facts

- Prior to the 1835 Highways Act the width of Main street covered the area from the boundary wall of Monk Fryston Hall to the Boundary wall of the Church Grave Yard of St Wilfrid's church. This can be clearly seen on the OS map of 1850 and on the preceded inclosure map of 1793. The road in this position is in generally the same state at those times. It has clearly been demonstrated that the said highway was in place at the time of the 1835 Highways Act.
- 2. Between the maps of 1850 and 1891 the line of the road was altered to give the general configuration that we see today. Main street was effectively split into 2 highways which is clearly shown on the 1891 map. This reconfiguration doesn't remove the obligation for each section to be maintained at public expense.
- 3. The highways act of 1835 and subsequent acts specifically specify that if a highway was in place prior to the act then in is maintainable at public expense. It is only highways created after the 1835 act where there is a requirement for adoption. As the highway in question was in place prior to 1835 then there is no requirement for adoption.




OS Map 1850 (extract)

Section 13 LGA 1894

'13.—(1.) The consent of the parish council and of the district council shall be required for the stopping, in whole or in part, or diversion, of a public right of way within a rural parish, and the consent of the parish council shall be required for a declaration that a highway in a rural parish is unnecessary for public use and not repairable at the public expense, and the parish council shall give public notice of a resolution to give any such consent, and the resolution shall not operate—

(a) unless it is confirmed by the parish council at a meeting held not less than two months after the public notice is given; nor

(b) if a parish meeting held before the confirmation resolve that the consent ought not to be given.

(2.) A parish council may, subject to the provisions of this Act with respect to restrictions on expenditure, undertake the repair and maintenance of all or any of the public footpaths within their parish, not being footpaths at the side of a public road, but this power shall not nor shall the exercise thereof relieve any other authority or person from any liability with respect to such repair or maintenance. '

Supplementary note

This section determines the process if a highway is no longer required. No such agreement has been made for the highway in question.
