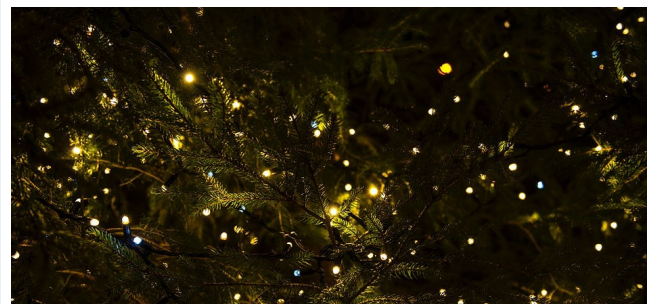

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS PLAN

PROGRESSING



At our September meeting, the Parish Council approved an initial plan for the location of Christmas decorations this year.

The plans include string lights on selected trees, motif lights on selected lampposts, and a 'Merry Christmas' sign.

Approval of this initial plan allows us to take the next steps. We hope that residents, and particularly children, will enjoy the decorations when they are installed over the festive period.

PARISH COUNCIL CONTINUING TO PUSH FOR ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

After much hard work, the Parish Council have taken positive steps towards improving Road Safety within the village over recent weeks.

Our long and hard-fought campaign to bring forward a pedestrian crossing to the village on the busy A63 took big steps forward with the

North Yorkshire Executive Member for Highways and Transportation, Road Safety and Cycling, Active Travel Champion (and North Yorkshire Mayoral Candidate) Keane Duncan visiting the village to meet with Councillors about parishioner concerns and our outline plans for solutions.



Keane's advice is helping to inform our strategy, so we place our strongest bid yet for a much-needed pedestrian crossing so that we can safely link both sides of the village and ensure our community can safely cross the road.

We've also been undertaking speed assessments outside of Monk Fryston Primary School and working with North Yorkshire Council and other partners to assess the need for a reduction to 20 mile per hour zone directly outside the school on Water Lane, which we feel would improve road safety, particularly for the local school community.

We keep a close eye on our road network on your behalf, and we'd like to reassure that we bring all matters to Highways attention as they are the responsible party. Highways are responding to several requests from us to complete repairs and works promised to our community. We shall maintain this pressure.

All in all, we enter the season of darker nights with renewed optimism that Monk Fryston can be a safe village for all road users, and the community can be assured that councillors will be working hard to secure solutions to our road safety challenges.
